

Festival of Archaeology 2013







Due to the success of the 2012 Festival of British Archaeology event at the Elan Valley Visitor Centre we at CPAT were keen to continue the working relationship with the Elan Valley Trust and build on that success. To this end, on Sunday 14th July, Abi McCullough and Sophie Watson ran a 'Family Archaeology Day' with various things to make and do including coil pot making (see middle photo above). In addition this year project archaeologist Ian Grant of CPAT coordinated a living history event with the help of other members of *Cwmwd Iâl*, his early medieval renactment group. Over 80 people, children, parents and grand-parents enjoyed the day in glorious weather.

A week later Jeff Spencer led a guided walk around the ruins of Dolforwyn Castle for people wanting to learn more about this often overlooked but fascinating site. Built by Llewellyn, Prince of Wales, it was a challenge to the nearby castle at Montgomery and the authority of Edward I.
